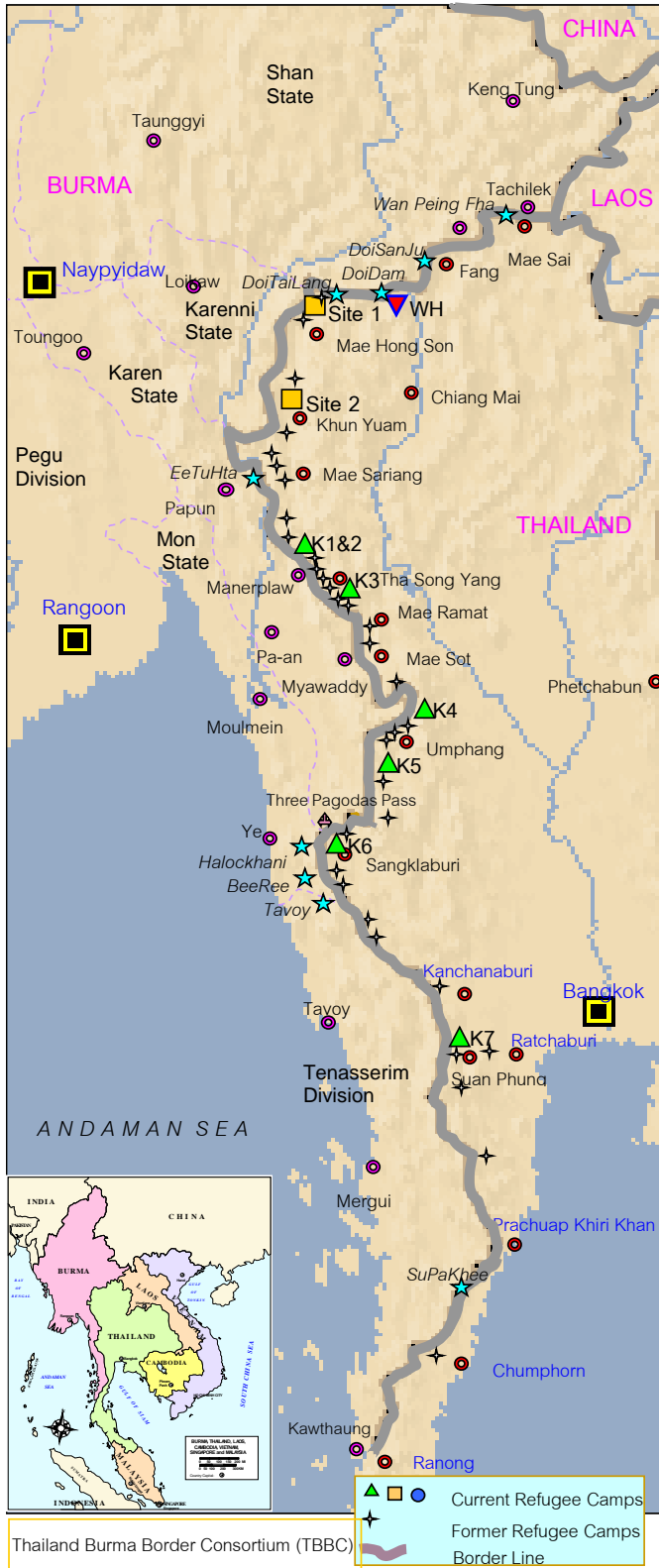

It excludes all permanently out of camp. Rations are provided only to those personally attending distributions and actual feeding figures are typically 4% lower than the caseload.
