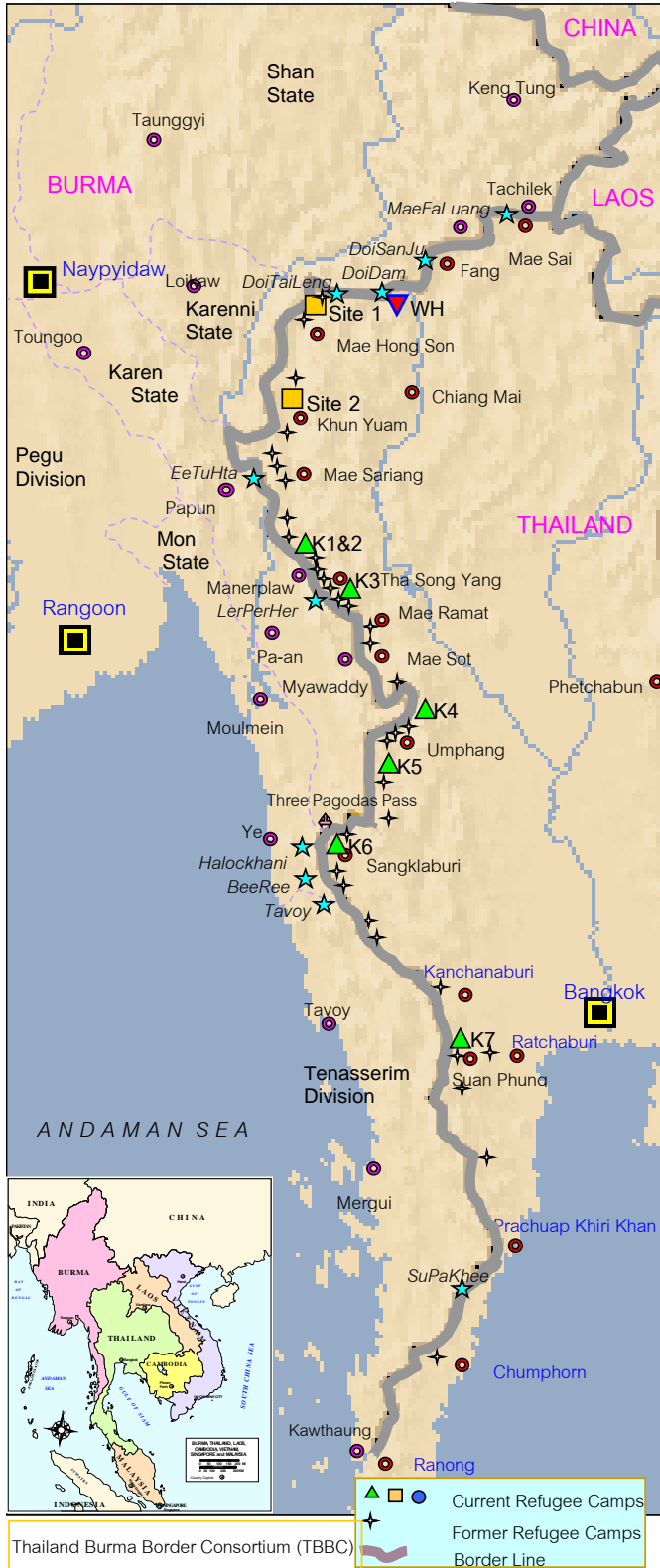

Mae La figures exclude significant numbers on camp lists but yet to be verified. Rations are provided only to those personally attending distributions and actual feeding figures are typically 4% lower than the caseload.

2. UNHCR figure includes registered, pending PAB and some students but excludes new arrivals.
