

Notes:

It excludes all previously verified residents now permanently out of camp. Rations are provided only to those personally attending distributions. Actual feeding figures are typically 4% lower than the caseload.
2. MOI/UNHCR figure includes registered, pending PAB and some students but excludes most new arrivals since 2005.
